Built at Arbuthnot's Koondrook Sawmill in 1923, and named after the former owner Alexander James Cooke Arbuthnot, PS Alexander Arbuthnot was the last paddlesteamer built on the Murray River during the riverboat trade.

In 1989 PS Alexander Arbuthnot was brought to Echuca and, after being abandoned for many years, she was lovingly restored. At 93 years old, PS Alexander Arbuthnot now shares passenger cruises with PS Pevensy departing daily from the Echuca Wharf.
